10/6/19: Sermon Notes on Churched: We are Word-Driven (Eph. 1:18-23; 2 Tim. 4:1-4)

The church is the greatest entity every created (called-out community), revolving around the greatest Person who ever lived (Christ), promised the greatest protection ever given ("the gate of Hades will not overcome it") with the greatest partnership ever afforded (family, body, flock, etc.) on the greatest mission (making disciples) ever announced with the greatest message ever communicated (life-saving gospel).

- **God's Word** comes in a living version (Jesus Christ) and a written version (Bible) that must drive the church's life and meaning.
- 1. We are driven by the written inspired Word of God (2 Tim. 4:1-4)
- Pastors are called to "preach the Word" no matter what kind of season it is (in or out) and do with positively ("exhort with great patience and instruction") and negatively ("reprove, rebuke")
- John MacArthur shared "Five Reasons Why We Must Preach the Word"
 - Because of the danger of the seasons (2 Tim. 3:1-9): The "last days" (living in since Christ ascended) are difficult and going from "bad to worse" (v. 13) as church history reveals
 - 2. Because of the devotion of the saints (2 Tim. 3:10-14): Paul calls Timothy to "continue in the things you have learned..." (v. 14), so the church doesn't need to reinvent ministry, but carry out what God has already instructed.
 - 3. Because of the dynamic of the Scriptures (2 Tim. 3:15-17): The heart and soul of why we must preach the Word is because of its profound power to save (v. 15) and sanctify (grow us v. 16-17)
 - 4. Because of the demand of the Sovereign God (2 Tim. 4:1): The ministry is a sober serious calling that demands we honor the Lord first and foremost as leaders must give an account (James 3:1; Heb. 13:17).
 - 5. Because of the deceptiveness of the sensual (2 Tim. 4:3-4): The flesh wants to feel good, be entertained, gratified and stroked, but this will lead to deception and a lack of discernment.
- 2. **We are driven by the living incarnate Word of God** (Eph. 1:18-23 and other references)

• Eph 1:18-23 is a prayer Paul prays for our enlightenment about what God has done for us and in us. He closes his prayer by wanting us to spiritually see Christ's supreme position (God's right hand; far above all; all things in subjection under his feet; head over all things to the church)

• 5 ways the church is driven by Jesus Christ

- 1. Jesus Christ is our supreme God, therefore we are fully accountable to Him. Whether you look at His claims, His sinlessness, His power to forgive sin ,His names and attributes, His reception of worship or even the testimony of His enemies-John 10:30-33, He is God. He is our Lord, Judge and "head over all to the church" (Eph. 1:22; 4:15; 5:23; Col. 1:18), so we must all give an account of ourselves to Him (Rom. 12:10; 2 Cor. 5:10)
- 2. Jesus Christ is our sin-bearing Savior, therefore we must be forgiven by Him. All over the Scripture, Jesus is our only hope of salvation: the Savior of the body" (Eph. 5:23), the "Author of salvation" (Heb. 2:10; 12:2), the "bread of life out of heaven" (Jn. 6:35, 48), the "Deliverer" (Rm. 11:26); the "door of the sheep" (Jn. 10:7), our "Eternal life" (1 Jn. 1:2; 5:20), the "Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world" (Jn. 1:29, 36), the "light of the world" (Jn. 8:12), the "one mediator between God and men" (1 Tim. 2:5); our "redemption" (1 Cor. 1:30), "the resurrection and the life" (Jn 11:25) and "the way" to God (John 14:6). We "repent and believe in the gospel" as Jesus preached (Mark 1:15)
- 3. Jesus Christ is our sympathetic High Priest, therefore we can win the battle against sin. He is our mediator (1 Tim. 2:5), identifies with our temptations and suffering as one who "sympathizes with our weaknesses" (Heb 4:15) and "is able to come to the aid of those who are tempted" (Heb. 2:17-18). He intercedes for us in prayer (Rom. 8:34) and "always lives to make intercession for us" (Heb. 7:25 He is the great truth-source of the church (Col. 2:3-4; 1 Cor. 1:30). He is our defense attorney (advocate) when we "sin" whether the enemy accuses (Rev. 12:11) or slanders us (1 Jn. 2:1: "we have an Advocate with the Father, JC the righteous")
- 4. Jesus Christ is our sufficient life, therefore we can fully trust Him. Christ gives the church everything she needs. We're "complete in Him" (Col. 2:10), "blessed with every spiritual blessing in the heavenlies" (Eph. 1:3) and "granted us everything pertaining to life and godliness" (2 Pet 1:3). He's the source of real life (Jn 1:3: "in Him was life", called "our life" (Col. 3:4) is "the great Shepherd of the sheep" (Heb. 13:20). In Christ, we discover "we are not adequate in ourselves to consider anything as coming from ourselves, but our adequacy is from God" (2 cor. 3:5) and that "all things belong to you, and you belong to Christ

- and Christ belongs to God" (1 Cor. 3:23) and "to us" He is "wisdom from God and righteousness and sanctification and redemption" (1 C. 1:30).
- 5. Jesus Christ is our soon coming King, therefore we must be ready to meet Him (Rev. 22:12). He is coming to rapture His church (1 Th. 4:13-18, 1 Cor 15:51-58), reconstruct our bodies (I Cor. 15:52-53), reward His people (Rev. 22:12; Rom 14:10-12, 2 Cor. 5:10, I Cor. 3:10-15, I Cor. 3:13), release His wrath upon sin and unbelievers for 7 years (Revelation 6-19), to remove the curse (Romans 8:19-23, 2 Peter 3:10-13), to rule the world (Rev 11:15, 19:11-21, 20:1-6) as the "KINGS OF KINGS AND LORD OF LORDS" (Rev. 19:16) and reconcile all things to Himself (Col. 1:20, I Cor. 15:20-28)
