Churched: We Worship

The church is called to worship.

- Peter commands us to "proclaim the excellencies of Him who called you out of darkness into His marvelous light" (1 Peter 2:9)
- The church is a glory-displaying community (Eph. 3:21: "To Him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus to all generations forever and ever. Amen.")
- Worship is not something we come to, it is what we believe and express as God's *ekklesia* (called out ones) whether gathered or scattered.
- Our testimony is that we "turned to God from idols to serve a living and true God" (1 Thess. 1:10), yet true worship will be a battle and we are called to The church is called to worship.
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- Our testimony is that we "turned to God from idols to serve a living and true God" (1 Thess. 1:10), yet true worship will be a battle and we are called to "guard ourselves from idols" (1 John 5:21)

Worshipping God is giving Him all that I am (mind, emotion, will, body) to all that He is, says and does.

- Peter's purpose statement in 1 Peter 2:9-10 inspires us to take our worship to the next level:
- 1. God's "excellencies" describe **WHY** He deserves to be worshipped.
 - God is the only true God (Isa. 46:9) and the only One to worship (Luke 4:8).
 - a) He's the only **Creator** (Psalm 95:3, 6-7; Isa. 40:25-26; Rev. 4:11)
 - b) He's the only **controller** of all things (1 Tim. 6:15: "the only Sovereign"; Dan. 4:34-37; Eph. 1:11)

- c) He's the only **converter** of hearts (only "Savior" and "Redeemer"; Isa. 49:26; 43:11; 1 Pet. 2:9)
- d) He's the only **culminator** of all things (1 Cor. 15:25-28)
- What is the chief end of man? Man's chief end is to glorify God and enjoy Him forever (the first question and answer in the Westminster Shorter Catechism of 1647)
- 2. God's "excellencies" drive **HOW** He deserves to be worshipped.
 - Worship is a verb and is therefore an intentional response to what you love and value the most in every realm of life (1 Cor. 10:31)
 - Think about five ways to worship God.
 - 1. Worship with a **readied** heart (Heb. 10:22: prepare your heart): Avoid distractions (Phil. 4:8), confess your sins (Heb. 10:22) and worship with expectancy
 - 2. Worship with a **receptive** mind (John 4:24: "in spirit and truth"): Saturate your life with the Word of God (Psalm 119:7, 12, 38, 62)
 - 3. Worship with some **roused** emotion: a rejoicing heart (Ps. 35:9); humble spirit (Phil. 3:3); God-fearing attitude (Ps. 22:23); contrite heart (Ps. 51:17); lamenting heart (Ps. 142:5-6)
 - Worship with a **righteous** will (we choose to worship God): we choose to pray (Ps. 5:2); obey (Deut. 10:12-21); give (Deut. 16:16-17); forgive (Eph. 4:32b); love (Matt. 22:39); serve excellently (Mal. 1:6-10); do good works (Matt 5:16)
 - 5. Worship with a **responsive** body (Rom. 12:1): Do this with a singing mouth (Ps. 105:2); bent knee (Ps. 95:6); bowed head (2 Chron. 29:30); clapping hands (Ps. 47:1); uplifted hands (Ps. 134:2); dancing feet (Ps. 149:2); grounded face (Job 1:20); shouting voice (Ps. 95:1); witnessing tongue (Ps. 96:1-6); thankful mouth (Col. 3:17); hard work (Col 3:23); greeting one another (Eph. 1:2)
